Northwest Wisconsin residents and farmers can properly dispose of their hazardous chemicals. There is no charge for *most* materials for households and farms (see fee items below). Businesses, governmental units/agencies and schools are charged a small disposal fee and **must** pre-register by calling Jen Barton, Northwest Regional Planning Commission, at (715) 635-2197.

Hazardous Wastes Accepted

Oil & solvent-based paint, lead paint, stains, shellac, varnish, wood preservatives, roof coatings, driveway sealers

Pesticides, herbicides, insecticides, fungicides, poisons

Household cleaners, acids, caustics, pool chemicals - chlorine, aerosols

Automobile transmission & brake fluids, antifreeze, degreasers

Solvents, thinners, turpentine, adhesives, kerosene, lighter fluid, gasoline

Rechargeable batteries (must not be leaking). Lead acid, Ni-Cad, Ni-MH and laptop. Terminal ends must be taped by customer for transportation. *No alkaline batteries*

Medications Accepted

Prescription and over-the-counter medications including: pills, capsules, ointments, liquids, sprays, creams, inhalers, vials and drops. Please keep meds in their original containers, black-out or remove name on prescription bottles. (No needles or syringes.)

Proper Disposal of Mercury Waste

Simple household items can contain heavy metals and mercury that can contaminate rivers, lakes and fish if not properly disposed of. Bring the following items from your home to one of our household hazardous waste collections so they can be recycled or managed properly:

- Mercury batteries
- Button batteries
- Thermostats and switches
- Fluorescent and HID lamps
- Some types of old paint
- Liquid mercury
- Thermometers

Agricultural Program

Northwest Clean Sweep will accept the first 200 lbs. of chemicals from farmers or abandoned farms for free. Farmers with agricultural related wastes can participate at any of the household hazardous waste collection events or at the permanent collection site in Spooner.

- Electronics (radio, stereo, phones, cell phones, VCR/DVD/Blu-Ray, desktop printers, desktop copiers, and scanners, game consoles and more)

Accepted for a Fee (each)

Projection TV and counsel TV's	\$45.00
TV's and CRT tubes/monitors	\$10.00
4' and under fluorescent bulbs (includes circ-lars, CFL's and U-tubes) . Heavy-weight incandescent bulbs (incl. spot & floor lamps)	\$.50
Over 4' fluorescent bulbs	\$.75
Oil filters	\$1.00
4' and under shatter shield type fluorescent bulbs	\$1.75
Over 4' shatter shield type fluorescent bulbs	\$2.25
High-intensity discharge (HID) lamps (includes high pressure sodium, metal halide and mercury vapor)	\$2.50

Unacceptable Items

- Latex Paint
- Empty paint cans
- Motor Oil
- Vehicle Batteries
- Explosives
- Freon 11 & 12
- Radioactive Materials
- Ammunition
- Compressed Gas Cylinders (larger than camp stove size)
- Recyclables
- Alkaline Batteries
- Appliances
- Asbestos
- Biological or Infectious Wastes-medical
