AHAC asked to submit formal report to help this committee understand the current housing conditions.

- General thoughts on current Housing, Land Use goals: vague list of wishes, virtues and statements of what would be nice; hard to measure; too many objectives and policies, few defined or specific actions; topics are in silos
- General thoughts on what is needed: solutions that identify needs and recommend specific action steps and timelines; set of proposals that recognize connections among goals, bundle them as a system; policies that are measurable/accountable; utilize wisdom of affinity groups
- General thoughts on affordable housing: think outside the box (eminent domain, tax abatement?); recognize need for complex funding streams and partnerships among public, private, nonprofit sources; be aware of unintended consequences; balance development/preservation, ownership/rental, year-round/seasonal; need a lifecycle continuum if we want a diverse community; what zoning needs to be tweaked?
