Welcome to February 2022, I have completely changed the reporting on the chief's report. Attached you will find a color print out and graph from the CODY report writing system that gives exact numbers of the calls we have handled. In January we handled more Parking, Animal and Community Policing than any of the other calls for service.

Change comes with a little explanation, no longer will I total the number of incidents in one number, but for this month, totals were 34, which is not unusual for January.

Now some of the incidents are self-explanatory. however, considering that I do not control how the CODY report writing system enters calls, or be able to change any of the abbreviations, this is out of my control so a few must be explained.

1046 is a disabled vehicle
C.P is Community Policing (formerly citizen assist)
TRAFF5 is simply a car crash which includes a car stuck in snow or a complete crash
TRAFHZ is a traffic hazard such as a tree in the road
VEUNLO is a vehicle unlock
TRSTP is a traffic stop

Now I'm sure you see a discretion in parking enforcement and how many parking tickets are issued. Parking enforcement and TRSTP (traffic stops) will show the number of incidents but not the number of citations issued. The counts and numbers for others may seem different as we used to count a vehicle unlock as a citizen assist, now they are separated.


Another aspect of this is the chart that shows the percentage of calls that happen on a particular day.


As far as what else is happening in the department, we are looking at our spring training requirements and looking at filling shifts as the summer comes on.


Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 15 of 15 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)

We will be sending guys off to training in the near future to get their mandatory 24 hours Inservice.






Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 20 of 20 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)

It is April and we are a little saddened that the ice road is done and that windsled season is nearly over but that just means warmer weather ahead and with that a ferry and more people on the island.



When the gas went up, we started limiting our patrols to save fuel, now that fuel is coming back down, and the fact that the ferry season is just a few weeks away (if that), we will be stepping up patrols again. Still trying to conserve fuel, just more appearances where we need to be seen.


Officers will begin yearly training this month to get to the required yearly training set by the Department of Justice. Yearly training is not optional, it is required by statute to maintain officer certification.


Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 13 of 13 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)


Officers are involved in the national campaign of Click It or Ticket that runs from May 23rd through June 5th. We get involved in these campaigns for the opportunity for equipment grants.

Speaking of seat belts, we have recently talked to folks regarding vehicles that were not originally equipped with safety belts. There is an exemption for adults in these vehicles. However, children under 8 are not and the statute reads as follows.

347.48(4)(am) No person may transport a child under the age of 8 in a motor vehicle unless the child is restrained in compliance with par. (as) in a safety restraint system that is appropriate to the child's age and size and that meets the standards established by the department under this paragraph. The department shall, by rule, establish standards in compliance with applicable federal standards, including standards under 49 CFR 571.213, for child safety restraint systems.



Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 26 of 26 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)





June was a typical June; we are happy to say that the in-line skate race went without any major hiccups.

Click it or Ticket ran from May 23rd to June 5th, there were really no major things to report with this program.

All officers completed their annual required training and as of July 1 it is a new training year, our goal is to try and get officers yearly training in as soon as we can utilizing as much in house as we can.

This month's topic is Low Speed Vehicles (LSV's). What is an LSV? A LSV is a street-legal, four-wheeled electric vehicle with a top speed of 25 mph and a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 3,000 lb. Wisconsin allows LSVs to drive on roads marked 35 mph or less.


What is the difference between an LSV and a golf cart?

Essentially, a golf cart is not approved for on road use. A low-speed vehicle, or "LSV", is a motor vehicle that has been modified for limited street use and is approved for use by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Further an LSV can be registered for on road use.

You may see one driving around but know the difference between what is legal and not legal to driver on the road when it comes to these vehicles. They have to be stamped from the manufacturer to be able to be used for on road use.



Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 29 of 29 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)





July 4th was not as busy as expected; however, the weather likely played a role in that. The rest of the month was rather typical. Only one person was taken off island to the jail, a few reports referred to the DA's office.

We are hearing complaints of speeding, which is rather normal for this time of year. Officers are out making traffic contacts. If you have not guessed, the number one reason for speeding is "I'm running late for the ferry", just remember that getting stopped for speeding will likely make you miss your ferry. Leave earlier, take your time, get in line with time to spare.

Once again, we are seeing kids in the back of pick-up trucks. Wi Statute 346.922 prohibits children from riding in the back of pickup trucks. It has also been reported that people have been riding in towed or trailered boats which is prohibited by Wi statute 346.94(8). The citations for these offenses are not necessarily cheap, please, make safety a part of your time on the island.

Officers have entered the new training year; I will be attending the Summer Police Leadership Conference in August. Yearly mandatory training of Emergency Vehicle Operations will take place this fall and firearm qualifications will begin in August.






By Day of Week

I have one officer scheduled for training in November, and we are working on next year's training for everyone else.







Officer Rahlf is headed to some training this month; he is getting special training in Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) which is above and beyond the standardized field sobriety training most of us have.

Did you know? Anyone who sells a motor vehicle from one individual to another individual, including transferring a junk vehicle by bill of sale, the seller must submit notification to the DMV that a sale has occurred. According to Wis. Stat. 342.41, sellers within 30 days of a sale the seller needs to report to WisDOT the:
Vehicle identification number (VIN) of the vehicle, Identity of the individual buyer
Sale price and Date of sale. For ease, you can do it all on the DOT website. If the seller does not, and the new buyer gets involved in a vehicle crash, gets a parking ticket, etc.. you may be liable.






Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 22 of 22 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)


I have been working with DOT to place an intoximeter machine here on the island so that we could do a breath test 1st offense OWI's. I have a place approved to put the machine, as they did a site visit, there are a few things to do to get the room up to standards. We will be starting to send officers to school to be able to use the machine when it gets here. Normally they do not give departments with low volume a machine, but the representative from the DOT believed we were an exigent circumstance.




Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 17 of 17 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)

Calls for service were down in December, that is not unusual for December, January and February being our down months. We take this time to catch up on maintenance, filing etc.





Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 11 of 11 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)




By Day of Week
