I Cannot say that we are not enjoying the warmer temperatures this year, but will again miss an ice road. This has been a typical month for call volume, Ashland County (at least in the system) received no calls for the island this month and did not hold any over. Calls included an open door that was found on a cabin, an intoxicated driver, a one vehicle crash with damage, a vehicle in the ditch and several traffic stops.

I partook in a combination Wisconsin Police Chiefs and Badger Sheriff association Legislative Advocacy Day at the State Capital. We spoke wo legislators about increasing training reimbursements, establishing a regional crisis center for chapter 51 commitments, to allow recoupment of redaction costs when it comes to videos, allowing WRS annuitants more hours per month.

In conjunction with the legislative advocacy, I was able to hand out a flier made by our Town Admin to Legislators as well that outlines our issues with providing affordable law enforcement on the island and lack of service from the Sheriff's Office/County. Our local Legislators seemed interested in trying to find ways to try to remedy the situation.

By the time you receive this, I will have attended training with the Wisconsin Police Leadership Foundation, which is the annual training I attend.

We are working with all the officers in training opportunities that are coming up.







Well, a lack of snow has definitely resulted in a lack of visitors to the island, calls were on par for a normal February, if there was an ice road, they would have been doubled.

This past month there was a suspicious "explosion" on February 12th that we never found the source of. Many folks heard the loud boom on the southeast side of the island. It was originally thought that it was a sonic boom from a military jet, but no fighter wings were doing training in our area on that day. We have also received a few 911 hang-up calls; these were from the same person. We assisted EMS 2 times and had two alarms from two separate homes.

I attended the Wisconsin Police Leadership Foundation training in February, from that I ended up on the Wisconsin Chiefs Association 4th class Cities/Villages/Towns committee with the Association representing agencies in northern Wisconsin. This committee works on common problems with small agencies throughout the state on a legislative level.

Both Karl and Tom will be attending training in March, Karl is attending DOT training in Rice Lake and Tom will be attending Firearms instructor training in Eau Claire.







The new squad laptops have arrived, we hope to have them in the squads by the end of April. They are getting dropped off to Will for an initial set up, then we have to make an appointment with Badger TraCs to have the software installed.

I have been sending out mutual aid requests for the Madeline Island Marathon to both GLIFWC and the WI State Patrol. Both are planning to send someone over to help with traffic control for the event.






By Day of Week







A message for residents and visitors, please do not leave valuables in unlocked cars, we have already had a few thefts complaints to items missing from vehicles that were not locked.




Well here comes August, statistically the busiest month of the year for the police department yet in July there were a total of 16 911-hangup calls, we assisted the ambulance 15 times, unlocked vehicles 9 times, several moped crashes, a fraud case, an assault, a harassment case, a violation of a court order case, one Domestic and a completely naked man walking on the beach past houses over by grants point. Needless to say, it was a busy month.

I would like to bring up that one of our officers handled another man with a gun call on August 3, 2024. We have had several of these calls the past few years, and we have been very lucky that no one has been hurt. The more startling fact than getting calls like this and the fact they are becoming more common, is that we have been handling these calls and have been denied backup or any response from Ashland County for all these cases including this incident.

We will be going back to scheduling days where the county is once again responsible for response to the island after Labor Day weekend. The Sheriff's department has said over and over again "they will only respond to the island if there is a call and will not post a deputy on the island". History over the past fall/winter/spring has shown they barely showed up for any calls that were called in from island residents. On these days, even in an emergency, you can expect a response of 1.5 to 2 hours at minimum from the mainland. I have been trying to work with them to get a deputy here on some days, so far this has not been successful (ill keep trying).




### Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 36 of 36 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)

The bear hunters did have a successful season this year and we are in small game and bow season for deer. Hunters, please know where you can and cannot hunt.




Incident Frequency by TYPE (Top 26 of 26 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)

I have gone over several functions of my job with both Thom and Karl and they will be teaming up to tackle most everything.








By Day of Week
